

INTRODUCTION

I offer my simple songs at the shrine of humanity, that all share my soul joy. May the Spirit in these devotional outpourings restore in many men the wilting blossom of high aspiration.

In naming the book Whispers from Eternity I mean, by Eternity, God in the aspect of the Eternal Mother. In the Lord's transcendent aspect, the Absolute, He is unreachable by human thought; but in His immanent aspect—permeating the atoms of the universal structure, externalizing Himself in man and Nature—He is near and approachable, the Refuge and Redeemer of every creature.

In the Hindu scriptures His immanence is symbolized as the Mother that presides with watchful love over the destinies of countless beings and over the developments of the endless cycles of creation.*

It is this personalized aspect of the Ultimate Reality that may be said to have "longings" for the rightful behavior of Her children and to answer gladly their prayers.

Those who imagine that the Impersonal cannot manifest Itself in a personal form are inteffect denying Its omnipotence and the possibility that man can commune with his Maker. The Lord has often appeared in living tangibility before true bhaktas (devotees of a personal God). Down the ages He has materialized Himself before the gaze of true devotees in whatever forms they hold most dear. A Christian sees Jesus, a Moslem sees Mohammed, a Hindu sees Krishna or Rama,* and so on.

The Lord yearns to behold each man playing perfectly his given role on earth. It is by misuse of free will that human beings thwart the divine plan. Absence of the clamor of egotistical desires enables us to hear and heed the guiding Voice within. Free from self-will, men of wisdom carry on their activities in effortless accordance with God's design.

"Not as I will, but as Thou wilt," Jesus prayed. No karma accrues to the man who rightfully enacts his part in the drama of earthly life.

Divine recollection is the simplest way to achieve God-communion. Our inner assertion of spiritual identity is sufficient to operate the law

for fulfillment of prayers. This law has been utilized by saints of all ages. From the depths of his own experience, Christ was able to give us this glorious assurance:

"If ye have faith, and doubt not . . . if ye shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea, it shall be done. And all things whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive."*

Supplications to the Indwelling Spirit should be made with intense fervor. They will be answered by soul whispers — silent mysterious responses that quickly transform one's life.

Devotees who, with closed eyes, repeat over and over the affirmations in this book, trying to feel their deep truths, will *spiritualize* them; that is, rouse the inspiration slumbering beneath the thick silken quilt of words.

Invocations to the Lord are like everliving plants that ceaselessly put forth new blossoms. The prayer plants in Whispers from Eternity retain the same branches of words; yet, if watered by the divine dew of meditation, each plant will daily yield fresh soul flowers of inexhaustibly varied insights.

Teach us to chant in harmony the countless expressions of our supreme devotion. In Thy

Make me transparent with purity, that I manifest Thy healing light within me.

Still the restlessly moving mirror of my mind, that it reflect only Thine infinite face.

Fling wide the windows of faith, that I inhale Thy fragrance of peace.

O Self-Illumined, O Ineffable Effulgence, glance Thou into my ardent eyes, that I be blind forever to all but Thee.

May my gratitude be changeless

When the summer of good fortune warms my tree of life, it easily burgeons with fragrant blossoms of thankfulness.

During winter months of misfortune, O Lord, may my denuded branches changelessly waft

toward Thee a secret scent of gratitude.

The fivefold taper of my senses

O Living Lord, help me train the truant children of my senses not to wander away from perceptions of Thee.

Direct my gaze to Thy wondrous world within, to watch Thine ever changing beauty.

May I hear the lilt of Thy secret lyre.

Teach me to feel Thy presence in me, above me, beneath me, and around me.

Bless me, that I catch the scent of Thy breath of bliss.

Let me drink forever from the sourceless river of Thine inexhaustibility.

Orientwise, with sacred rites I offer at Thine altar the candles of my senses. May their spiritualized light mingle with Thine in the first pale shaft of dawn, the brash noon brightness, the muted glow of dusk, and the night's moon silver.

O Guardian of my being, keep ever burning before Thee the fivefold taper of my love.

May I live less by food and more by cosmic light

O Divine Life Energy that directly sustainest my body! Thou dost convert and spiritualize my food—solids, liquids, and air—into Thy revivifying

rays. Teach me, O Spirit, to live less and less by gross matter and more and more by cosmic light.

Thy power is present in my body bulb. I recharge myself with Thine omnipresent life.

The star that leads to the Christ Child

O Lord, I have long been engrossed in material things. Enthralled by their outward forms, I failed to perceive

within them Thy creative Spirit. The starry single eye* of my soul insight is now being opened. Through it may I behold creation ashine with Thy glory.

Bless me, that I ever see the Eastern† star of wisdom. May it gleam before my human eyes, alike in daylight and in gloom.

I am Thy divine dewdrop

I am Thy dewdrop, quivering on the leaf of life-and-death that floats on Thy shoreless sea.

I am Thy truant dewdrop, returning at last to the Hallowed Home.

I am Thine immortal dewdrop, dancing on the petals of past-present-future.

I am Thy love-enchanted dewdrop, sliding safely over the leaf of earthly lures to enter Thy taintless waters of wisdom. I want not to lose myself but to become infinitely enlarged by merging in Thy Sea.

I shall be Thine omnipresent dewdrop, imbibed by all God-thirsty lips.

God alone!

Who knows the secrets of all men, living and dead? God alone!

Who rested in the eternal void, before the atoms blinked glittering eyes and started the dance of creation? God alone!

We came here from some mysterious realm, we know not whence; we shall soon depart for another sphere, we know not whither. Who can explain the reason for our compulsory journeys? God alone!

With cause-effect threads we weave our intricate life patterns. Individuality and free-will mark the myriad designs. Who sees their hidden harmony with a divine schema? Who unifies the bewildering variety of man's creative expression? God alone!

Who understands the origin and destination of the grand procession of living creatures that endlessly emerges from mystic chambers of space? Who can tell in what skyey mansions now dwell the countless visitors to this planet who, at the touch of Death's magic wand, instantly vanished? God alone!

Our dear ones promise to love us forever; yet when they sink into the Great Sleep, their earth memories forsaken, what value their vows? Who, without telling us in words, loves us everlastingly? who remembers us when all others forget us? who will still be with us when we must leave the friends of this world? God alone!

Man plays his part, then hides behind the scenes at death, returning here in a new costume of flesh to perform again on the stage of time. Who recalls the previous roles of all persons? who is aware of their future assignments? who leads them surely through the baffling windings in the curious labyrinth of their many incarnations? God alone!

Why He is playing this game, and why He keeps the knowledge to Himself, sharing it only meagerly with us, His children, is a mystery understood by God alone.

When we dispel the delusion of physical-body identity we solve the riddle of life that sphinxlike confronts us. Who will then give us the clue to the Final Conundrum of the Cosmos? God alone!

Death's reply

Thine astral airplane of earthly parting came to take my soul away. I wondered through what starry vaults I was to soar, to what strange lands I was to travel.

I questioned the mystic emissary of cosmic law. Soundlessly he answered:

"I am the pilot of ever evolving life—often mistakenly called Terrible Death. I am thy brother, uplifter, redeemer, friend—unloader of thy gross burden of body troubles. I come to fetch thee away from the valley of thy broken dreams to a wondrous highland of light, to which poison vapors of sorrow cannot climb.

"I have removed thy soul bird from the cage of flesh attachment. Long imprisonment behind bars of bones made thee used to the cage, but unwillingly; thou didst always yearn for liberty. Now, cast away fear; thou hast won thine astral freedom!

"O transitory visitor to Earth, re-enter the beauteous skies! Explore once more thine ethereal home!"

Prayer before meditation

O Father, I cleanse the shrine of my heart with the holy waters of repentance.

My bold passions, my long-sheltered ignorance, tremblingly await sacrifice upon Thine altar.

My little prayers arouse themselves in reverence, expecting Thee. My little joys dance in harmony with the temple bells of the far-flung spheres.

The muffled drum of my craving beats deep for Thee. I repeat Thy Name on mystic beads, fashioned of my crystal teardrops and polished with my love for Thee. Come, Spirit, come!

Our purified rivers reach Thy Sea

O Oceanic Being, guide Thou the rivulets of our joys, that they be not lost in the sands of short-lived sense satisfactions.

May the brooklets of our sympathies not end in the desert of dreary selfishness.

Let the little, lonely, separately moving streamlets of our affections merge in Thy lake of illimitable love.

May the narrow rivers of our lives be widened by torrential rains of Thy blessings, and pass through vast lowlands of humbleness, self-sacrifice, and consideration for others, to enter in purity Thy Blissful Sea.

Give me fervor in divine love

O Spirit, teach me to worship Thee as wholeheartedly as a miser idolizes money. Let me be as deeply attached

to Thee as a drunkard is to wine. May I cling to Thee as stubbornly as erring ones adhere to their bad habits. Inspire me to crave Thee as a worldly man yearns for possessions.

I long to be as attentive to Thee as a mother to her newborn babe. Lead me to seek Thee with the self-abandonment of Thy greatest devotees.

O Adored of the Angels, with the first fervor of true lovers may I cherish Thee ever!

Diving for the Pearl of Great Price O Fathomless Ocean of Treasure! may I dive deep in seas of meditation for Thy wisdom pearls.

Teach me to plunge with headlong faith, carrying the sharp dagger of conscience to protect me against sharks of passions.

If I fail in one or many searches, let me not believe the vast inner main devoid of riches; rather, may I find fault with myself for doubts and unmethodical diving. By my sacred perseverance, guide me to discover in the most secret waters of consciousness the Pearl of Great Price.

Thine eagle of soul progress

Make me Thine eagle of soul progress, soaring far above dusty lanes of narrowness and bigotry. Call me

higher and higher, beyond earth vibrations and sun-obscuring clouds.

May I mount on the balanced wings of right living to the rarefied regions of clear perceptions of Thee. Above all storms of trials I shall climb to the heights of Thy heavenly eyrie.

Oh, make me Thine eagle of soul progress!

Save me from sense slavery

O Pristine Spirit of Purity! save me from insatiable sense cravings. Let my greedy

desires be reduced to dross in a white heat of wisdom. By stern non-cooperation may I control all unruliness of the senses. Guide me to cooperate only with Thy will, harmoniously playing my little note, performing my little deed, singing my little song.

Inspire me to use the senses only in wholesome ways; and to discipline them wisely, that they desire to contribute to my true happiness. Lead them to conform joyously to Thy plan for them: freshness, acuity, irreproachableness.

As electricity may either illuminate or destroy a building, so man's powers may glorify or devastate his life. Teach me, then, to employ rightly the sensory energies Thou hast entrusted to me.

Transmute my sense craving into soul craving. And, O Spirit! let me feel Thy rod of discipline if ever I stray senseward away from Thee.

Thou art
ever busy, O
Cosmic Potter!

Heavenly Father, we thank Thee for sharing with all creatures and natural forces Thy responsibilities in carrying on

the work of creation. May we, Thy human children, never complain of our tasks.

Dost Thou not keep the bee busy? and the animals, providing for their young? and the dark water-wagons of the sky, sprinkling rain on thirsty greens?

The dramatic earth-exit of Paramahansa Yogananda took place in Los Angeles after he had uttered the concluding words in a speech of welcome to the Ambassador of India. The great master had long been aware that March 7, 1952, would be the date of his mahasamadhi (a yogi's conscious departure from the body). A memorial booklet, published by Self-Realization Fellowship, describes the closing days of his life. (Publisher's Note)

I beheld Thee in Thy dances of creation, preservation, and destruction O Kali, I bow to Thee—all sheltering Mother Nature, ruler of time, space, form, and relativity. Invisible Spirit took shape in Thee, a visible Woman Divine.

The beauty spot of the moon is set between Thy spacious eyebrows. Clouds of eternity hide Thy face. Gusts of prophet lives blow aside momentarily Thy mystery veil, revealing to mankind glimpses of Thine ineffable beauty.

The countless worlds delineate Thy form—million-eyed, moon-garlanded, infinite in adornments and glories. In Thy changing robes are woven the dreams of creation, preservation, and destruction. On the endless etheric curtain of Thy mind a myriad cosmic dramas play. Thou dost entertain Thy good children and frighten Thy naughty ones.

O Kali Primordial, from Thy hand of creative power issue the vibrations of Aum, materializing in an inexhaustible, bewildering, and wondrous variety of finite forms. Another hand holds the astral sword of preservation, keeping guard over planetary rhythms and balances. Thy third hand clutches the severed head of Cosmos, symbolizing annihilation in Brahma's Night.* Thy fourth hand† stills the storm of delusion and bestows on devotees Thy rays of salvation.

Thou dost project the fabulous dream fiestas of the centuries: the pageant of human life and death, the birth and passing of civilizations, and the evolution and dissolution of solar systems.

On earth Thou art equally present in the slums of misery, the halls of festive prosperity, and the quiet shrines of wisdom.

O Pristine Mother, in the cyclic dawn of creation I beheld* Thee crowned with wild Nature, wearing the scant garment of primitive cultures and roaming amidst unpolished minds.

In the noonday of creation I saw Thee in full activity. Thy vast body perspired as Thou, unseen, didst accomplish the tasks set by the restless ambition of Thy children. They felt the strain of struggle; scorched by their own ego blaze, men implored Thee to send cooling breezes of soul peace.

The night of total destruction approached; I beheld Thee covered ominously with mourning veils. Thou didst plunge the universe into a

spinning stars. I hear Thee, too, in the twinkling bells of little, laughing, harmonious lives. Thou art nearer to me than the throbs of my heart; and I perceive Thee on the farthest horizon of consciousness.

O Dancer of Unsearchable Caprice! Thine entrancing footsteps ever echo in my soul.

Terrors of mundane delusion are but dreams Wrapped in the blanket of earthly hopes, I slept long. I dreamt that I was sitting on a throne; my face held a

bouquet of smiles. It soon withered; one by one the petals of merriment dropped.

Then I beheld myself in rags, lying on the jagged stones of poverty. In the unrelenting grip of adversities I sobbed bitterly. My tears fell unheeded; the world passed me by in mocking silence.

My heart wailed for Thy help. Moved by the spiritual force of my unceasing pleas, Thou didst waken me at last. In joy I found myself secure in Thee, beyond the reach of bewildering dualities.

Allah: Arabic word for God; the Name used by Moslems.

astral worlds: The beautiful realms of light and joy to which persons with a measure of spiritual understanding go for further development after death. Even higher is the causal or ideational sphere. These worlds are described in chapter 43 of Autobiography of a Yogi.

Aum or Om: The basis of all sounds; universal symbol-word for God. Aum of the Vedas became the sacred word Hum of the Tibetans; Amin of the Moslems; and Amen of the Egyptians, Greeks, Romans, Jews, and Christians. Amen in Hebrew means sure, faithful. Aum is the all-pervading sound emanating from the Holy Ghost (Invisible Cosmic Vibration; God in His aspect of Creator); the "Word" of the Bible; the voice of creation, testifying to the Divine Presence in every atom. Aum may be heard through practice of Yogoda Satsanga methods of meditation.

"These things saith the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the beginning of the creation of God."—Revelation 3:14. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God....All things were made by him [the Word or Aum]; and without him was not any thing made that was made."—John 1:1, 3.

Babaji: The guru of Lahiri Mahasaya (q.v.). Babaji is a deathless avatar, living secretly in the Himalayas. His powers are Christlike. His title is Maha-

- vatar, "great avatar." Glimpses of his life are given in Sri Yogananda's Autobiography of a Yogi.
- Bhagavad-Gita ("Song of the Lord"): The Hindu Bible: sacred sayings of Lord Krishna (q.v.), compiled millenniums ago by the sage Vyasa.
- Brahma: A Sanskrit word (from the root brih, to expand) for God in His aspect of Creator; Spirit as immanent in creation.
- breath: "The influx of innumerable cosmic currents into man by way of the breath induces restlessness in his mind," Sri Yogananda wrote. "Thus the breath links him with the fleeting phenomenal worlds. To escape from the sorrows of transitoriness and to enter the blissful realm of Reality, the yogi learns to quiet the breath by scientific meditation."
- Buddha ("The Enlightened One"): One of the avatars of India; born in the 6th century B.C. at Kapilavastu.
- Christ Consciousness: "Kutastha Chaitanya"—awareness of Spirit as immanent in every atom of vibratory creation. See Sat-Tat-Aum.
- Cosmic Consciousness: Awareness of Spirit as transcending finite creation. See Sat-Tat-Aum.
- Cosmic Sound: See Aum.
- egoism: The ego-principle, ahankara (lit., "I do"), is the root cause of dualism or the seeming separa-

tion between man and his Creator. Ahankara brings human beings under the sway of maya (q.v.), by which the subject (ego) falsely appears as object; the creatures imagine themselves to be creators.

By banishing ego-consciousness, man awakens to his divine identity, his oneness with the Sole Life: God.

Gandhi, Mohandas K. ("Mahatma"): The entire world has been inspired by the feat of this great political saint, who in 1947 won freedom for India without war. He disciplined millions of Indians in the practices of nonviolent resistance to injustice.

After his death, among thousands of other tributes, one from the Vatican in Rome read: "Gandhi is mourned as an apostle of Christian virtues." Albert Einstein said of the Mahatma: "Generations to come, it may be, will scarce believe that such a one as this ever in flesh and blood walked upon the earth."

gunas: The three attributes of Nature: tamas, rajas, and sattwa—obstruction, activity, and expansion; or, mass, energy, and intelligence. In man the three gunas express themselves as ignorance or inertia; activity or struggle; and wisdom.

guru: The spiritual preceptor who leads the disciple to God. The term "guru" differs from "teacher," as a person may have many teachers but can have only one guru. holy vibration: See Aum.

intuition: The "sixth sense"; apprehension of knowledge derived immediately and spontaneously from the soul, not from the fallible medium of the senses or of reason.

ji: A suffix denoting respect, added to names and titles in India; as, Gandhiji, Paramahansaji, guruji.

Kali: God in His aspect of Nature—the Cosmic Mother. In Hindu art She is represented as four-armed. One of the divine hands symbolizes Her powers of creation; the second hand, the universal principle of preservation; the third hand, the purifying forces of dissolution. Kali's fourth hand is outstretched in a gesture of blessing and salvation. In this fourfold way She leads all creation back to its source in Spirit.

karma: The equilibrating law of karma, as expounded in the Hindu scriptures, is that of action and reaction, cause and effect, sowing and reaping. In the course of natural righteousness, each man by his thoughts and actions becomes the molder of his destiny. Whatever energies he himself, wisely or unwisely, has set in motion must return to him as their starting point, like a circle inexorably completing itself. "The world looks like a mathematical equation, which, turn it how you will, balances itself. Every secret is told, every crime is punished, every virtue rewarded, every wrong redressed, in silence and certainty" (Emerson, in Compensa-

- tion). An understanding of karma as the law of justice serves to free the human mind from resentment against God and man. See Reincarnation.
- Koran: Sacred sayings of Mohammed; the scripture of the Moslems.
- Krishna (d. 3102 B.C.): An avatar of India whose divine counsel in the *Bhagavad-Gita* (q.v.) is revered by all who read it. In his early life he was a cowherd who enchanted his companions with the music of his flute. Allegorically, Sri Krishna represents the soul playing the flute of meditation to guide all misled thoughts back to the fold of omniscience.
- Kriya Yoga: An ancient yogic science of India, whose practice leads to attainment of Cosmic Consciousness. Its technique is praised by Sri Krishna in the Bhagavad-Gita and by Patanjali in the Yoga Sutras. The liberating technique is taught by Yogoda Satsanga Society.
- Lahiri Mahasaya (1828-1895): Guru of Sri Yukteswar (q.v.), and disciple of Babaji (q.v.). Lahiri Mahasaya revived the ancient, almost-lost science of yoga, giving the name of Kriya Yoga to the practical techniques. He was a Christlike teacher, with miraculous powers; he was also a family man with business responsibilities. His mission was to make known a yoga suitable for modern man, in which meditation is balanced by right performance

of worldly duties. Lahiri Mahasaya was a Yogavatar or "Incarnation of Yoga." His life is described in Sri Yogananda's Autobiography of a Yogi.

lotus symbol: The star in the lotus outline on the title page symbolizes the single eye of wisdom. See Spiritual eye.

Maya: The delusory power inherent in the structure of creation, by which the One appears as many. Maya is the principle of relativity, inversion, contrast, duality, oppositional states; the "Satan" (lit., in Herbrew, "the adversary") of the Old Testament prophets; and the "devil" whom Christ described picturesquely as a "murderer" and a "liar," because "there is no truth in him" (John 8:44). Sri Yogananda wrote:

"The Sanskrit word maya means 'the measurer'; it is the magical power in creation by which limitations and divisions are apparently present in the Immeasurable and Inseparable. Maya is Nature herself—the phenomenal worlds, ever in transitional flux as antithesis to Divine Immutability.

"In God's plan and play (lila), the sole function of Satan or Maya is to attempt to divert man from Spirit to matter, from Reality to unreality. The devil sinneth from the beginning. For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that he might destroy the works of the devil." (I John 3:8). That

is, the manifestation of Christ Consciousness, within man's own being, effortlessly destroys the illusions or 'works of the devil.'

"Maya is the veil of transitoriness in Nature, the ceaseless becoming of creation; the veil that each man must lift in order to see behind it the Creator, the changeless immutable eternal Reality."

- Mohammed: Seventh-century prophet; the great founder of Islam.
- Nanak: Medieval leader and illumined saint of the Sikhs.
- pagoda: A towerlike temple or memorial, common in India, China, and Japan. The pyramidal stone pagodas of India are among the finest examples of temple architecture. Chinese pagodas, usually made of brick, have a small rooflike projection at each successive story.
- Paramahansa: A religious title, signifying one who is master of himself. It is bestowed on a disciple by his guru. *Paramahansa* literary means "supreme swan." The *hansa* or swan is referred to in Hindu scriptures as a symbol of spiritual discrimination.
- prana: Cosmic life force in the human body and in all living creatures.
- Rama: An ancient avatar of India; central figure in the sacred epic, Ramayana.

Ramprasad (1718-1775): A Bengali saint who composed many songs in praise of Kali (q.v.), one of the aspects of the Divine Mother.

reincarnation: The doctrine set forth in the Hindu scriptures that human beings, entangled in a web of unfulfilled desires, are forced to return again and again to earth. When man consciously regains his true status as a son of God, the otherwise inexorable cycle of reincarnation ceases. "Him that overcometh will I make a pillar in the temple of my God, and he shall go no more out."—Rev. 3:12. Understanding of the law of karma and of its corollary, reincarnation, is implicit in many Bible passages.

The early Christian church accepted the doctrine of reincarnation, which was expounded by the Gnostics and by numerous church fathers, including Clement of Alexandria, the celebrated Origen, and the fifth-century St. Jerome. The theory was first declared a heresy in A.D. 553 by the Second Council of Constantinople. At that time many Christians thought the doctrine of reincarnation afforded man too ample a stage of time and space to encourage him to strive for immediate salvation. Today many Western thinkers accept the theories of karma and reincarnation, seeing in them the laws of justice that underlie life's seeming inequalities. See Karma.

samadhi: Superconsciousness. Samadhi is attained by following the eightfold path outlined in the Yoga

Sutras by the great ancient authority, Patanjali. Samadhi is the eighth step or final goal. Scientific meditation (the right use of yoga techniques developed millenniums ago by India's rishis, sages) leads the devotee to samadhi or God-realization. As the wave melts in the sea, so the human soul realizes itself as omnipresent Spirit.

- Sat-Sanga: Fellowship with man by appreciation; fellowship with God by meditation. In India Self-Realization Fellowship is called Yogoda Satsanga Society (q.v.),
- Sat-Tat-Aum: Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; or, God in the aspect of the Father: transcendent or nirguna, "without qualities"—Cosmic Consciousness in the blissful void beyond creation, beyond the phenomenal worlds; God in the aspect of the Son: Christ Consciousness (or Kutastha Chaitanya), immanent in creation; and God in the aspect of the Holy Ghost: Aum (q.v.), the Divine Creative Vibration.
- Self-Realization Fellowship (SRF): A nonprofit, nonsectarian religious and educational organization, founded in America in 1920 by Paramahansa Yogananda. Its affiliate in India is Yogoda Satsanga Society (YSS), founded in 1918 by Paramahansa Yogananda. Daya Mata is president of both organizations.

The chief work of Self-Realization Fellowship is dissemination of the teachings of Paramahansa

Yogananda by means of weekly lessons, sent to students; training of resident renunciate disciples; and publication in its printing plant of SRF books; also of Self_Realization Magazine, in which appear many of Paramahansa Yogananda's previously unpublished writings.

The Fellowship directs an SRF Voluntary League whose members supply food and clothing to the needy in various parts of the world; and an SRF Prayer Service, free to all. The members of the Prayer Service daily send healing vibrations by prayer to SRF students and all others who request help in healing and liberating themselves from man's threefold suffering: physical disease, mental inharmonies, and spiritual ignorance.

- Self-Realization Fellowship Order: The monastic order founded by Paramahansa Yogananda. After ten years of SRF hermitage training, eligible devotees became monks and nuns of the SRF Order. They take vows of sannyas: poverty (nonattachment to possessions), chastity, and obedience (willingness to follow the rules of life outlined by the founder, Paramahansa Yogananda).
- Shankara (Shankaracharya), Swami: India's most illustrious philosopher. His date is uncertain; many scholars assign him to the eighth century. He expounded God not as a negative abstraction but as positive eternal omnipresent ever new bliss.
- Shiva: The aspect of the Infinite Transcendental Spirit that exists in relation to Its "consort" Kali (q.v.)—the finite world of Nature.

spiritual eye: The "single" eye of wisdom, the pranic star door through which man must enter to attain cosmic consciousness. The method of entering the sacred door is taught by Yogoda Satsanga Society.

"I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture."—John 10:9. "When thine eye is single, by whole body also is full of light.... Take heed, therefore, that the light which is in thee be not darkness."—Luke 11:34-35.

Sri Yukteswar, Swami (1855-1936): The great guru of Paramahansa Yogananda, who called him *Inanavatar* or "Incarnation of Wisdom." Sri Yukteswar's beautiful life is described in Sri Yogananda's *Autobiography of a Yogi*.

Swami: A member of India's most ancient monastic order, reorganized in the eighth century by Swami Shankara (q.v.). A swami takes formal vows of celibacy and renunciation of worldly ambitions; he devotes himself to meditation and service to humanity. There are ten classificatory titles of the venerable Swami Order, as Giri, Puri, Bharati, Tirtha, Saraswati, and others. Swami Sri Yukteswar (q.v.) and Paramahansa Yogananda belonged to the Giri ("mountain") branch.

The Sanskrit word swami means "he who is one with the Self (Swa)."

Vedas: The four scriptural texts of the Hindus: Rig Veda, Sama Veda, Yajur Veda, and Atharva Veda. They are essentially a literature of chant and recitation. Among the immense texts of India, the Vedas (Sanskrit root vid, to know) are the only writings to which no author is ascribed. The Rig Veda assigns a celestial origin to the hymns and tells us they have come down from "ancient times," reclothed in new language. Divinely revealed from age to age to the rishis, "seers," the four Vedas are said to possess nityatva, "timeless finality."

- vihara: The temple and grounds of monasteries of the Buddhists and Jains.
- yoga: Literally, "union" of man with his Maker through practice of scientific techniques for Self-realization. The three main paths are *Inana Yoga* (wisdom), *Bhakti Yoga* (devotion), and *Raja Yoga* (the "royal" or scientific path, which includes the techniques of *Kriya Yoga*).
- yogi: One who practices yoga. He need not be a man of formal renunciation; a yogi is concerned solely with faithful daily practice of scientific techniques for God-realization.
- Yogoda Sat-Sanga Society (YSS): Founded in India in 1918 by Paramahansa Yogananda; headquarters, Yogoda Math, Dakshineswar, West Bengal. YSS has many branches in India, including a residential high school for boys in Ranchi, Bihar.

yuga: A cycle or subperiod of creation, outlined in ancient Hindu texts. In *The Holy Science*, a book in English by Sri Yukteswar (q.v.), he describes a 24,000-year Equinoctial Cycle and mankind's present place in it.

A "Day of Creation" is said to be four billion years; "One Age of Brahma" or the life span of a whole universe is given as 314 trillion years.
